REQUIREMENTS FOR ASSESSMENT COMMITTEES

When departments submit assessment committees for approval, it is now a requirement that the supervisor and members of the assessment committees have no joint publications within the last five years. THESIS SUBMISSION DURING THE SUMMER

Please note that Aalborg Universitetsforlag is closed July 10–31. You are still able to submit your thesis; it will, however, not be printed during this period. If it is URGENT, the thesis can also be sent for assessment during this period.

COURSE ON GOOD SCIENTIFIC PRACTICE

All PhD students must take the course on good scientific practice. The course is mandatory for PhD students enrolled from September 1, 2016 and onwards and is held 3 times annually with the next course taking place on August 29, 2017.
